#### **UK-Canada Globalink**

CPM SIG members, **Dr. Linda Trinh** (CPM Chair) from the University of Toronto and **Dr. Rebecca Beeken** (CPM Deputy Chair) from the University of Leeds are engaging in multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary research by participating in the UK-Canada Globalink doctoral exchange scheme. Dr. Beeken's doctoral student, William Goodman will be carrying out a 12-week research project focused on examining the longitudinal trends of sedentary behaviour and physical activity, and the associations with cancerrelated symptoms such as fatigue and distress, quality of life, and contextual factors in prostate cancer survivors. This project will aid in designing individually tailored interventions for prostate cancer survivors which could help individuals self-manage their own health, acknowledged as a key priority for both the UK and Canada. The Faculty of Kinesiology & Physical Education at the University of Toronto and Dr. Linda Trinh are thrilled to be hosting William Goodman in Winter 2022 and look forward to this collaboration.
