Here we are again at the doorstep of another ISBNPA cycle. The previous ISBNPA cycle culminated with a wonderful annual meeting in Omaha, Nebraska. It definitely exceeded all my expectations. Why?? The quality of presentations and keynotes was tremendous. The food was delicious and sustainable (Both vegetarian and very tasty! I swear it is indeed possible to have both!). We had a fantastic climate action session that highlighted the urgency to be actively engaged in addressing the biggest challenge of our times and different approaches to address it. We had more than 60% reduction in CO2e per person compared to ISBNPA 2023 in Uppsala. Finally, the organisation was impeccable ... so ... thank you once again Amy, Paul, Leah, Eric, the rest of the Omaha team, Venue West and many more! Well done!

While many of you might have been enjoying the summer holidays soon after our annual conference, a few of us, including the Executive Committee and, obviously, Antonio the Rock, have not stopped beavering away. And what have we been doing?

First, if you are a serious member of ISBNPA, you must know that the 'Growing the Next Generation' initiative led by Jenna Hollis and Steph Chappel launched a Building Future Leaders Program just before Omaha 2024. The pilot program was tailored to Middle Career Researchers and focused on the development of personal leadership skills. Well ... the first generation of future leaders has successfully and HAPPILY completed the course. We are now gathering their valuable feedback which will be incorporated in future iterations of the program for middle career as well as more junior researchers.

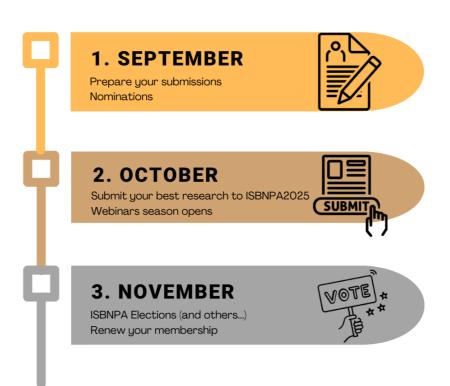
Second, if you are a serious member of ISBNPA, you will also be aware that we have been working on the next in-person meeting in Auckland, New Zealand, to be held on 11-14 June 2025. Submissions are already open for satellite meetings, pre-conference workshops, symposia, orals, dare2share and pioneer programs. We have been waiting for this event since 2020 when the COVID pandemic prevented us from celebrating the work of our society and its members in the magnificent Land of the Long White Cloud (Ao-teäroa). Take advantage of this unique opportunity to showcase your best research and broaden your horizons by exchanging knowledge with the indigenous population.

Third, we are approaching the end of ISBNPA's strategic plan cycle. It is time for us to critically reflect on what we have accomplished in the last few years and think about what and how we want to achieve in 2025-2030. For this reason, with the assistance of Oro, a group mentoring company that helped us develop the current plan, we will be soon conducting a series of focus groups for each of the four strategic initiatives to understand members' perceptions and seek their advice on how we can best move forward.

Lastly, the call for executive committee nominations opens on September 19. We will be seeking nominations for four positions, including the Secretary and three members-atlarge. Please consider this very important opportunity and send your nominations. A final thought about climate action. It is nice to see how this years' meeting in Omaha yielded more than 60% reduction in CO2e per person compared to the previous meeting. Let's continue on this path and broaden our influence. I invite all of you to think about how you could incorporate climate-related research in your work and send your ideas to us so that we can collectively engage in meaningful and impactful projects on this important topic.

- 2) Provide a platform to unite and strengthen international research on lifestyle behaviors and mental health.
- 3) Actively engage in impact generating activities,
- 4) Create opportunities for research, education, implementation and dissemination.

Indigenizing Wellbeing Research Circle

(Chairs: Britanny Wenniserí:iostha Jock and Rob Hogg - SIG webpage [HERE])

The IWRC will bring together Indigenous and non-Indigenous ISBNPA members to advance two

focus areas of behavioral nutrition and physical activity research:

- 1. The IWRC will center Indigenous peoples' knowledges, sovereignty, and self-determination within physical activity and behavioral nutrition research and elevate the voices of Indigenous Knowledge Carriers within these spaces.
 - a. We will support the next generation of Indigenous scholars by creating a sacred space for Indigenous scholars and trainees to be seen and valued as human beings.
- 2. From an Indigenous perspective, physical activity, nutrition, and wellbeing are the expression of our relationships to our territories and environments, and so the IWRC examines nutrition, physical activity and wellbeing wholistically (balancing physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual dimensions within human beings) and examines ways to support reciprocal relationships with the land and all aspects of creation. Further, our group highlights that:
 - a. Indigenous ceremonies, languages and spirituality are essential for wellbeing, and
 - b. Supporting the wellbeing of future generations of Indigenous youth and children are vital focus areas.

Systems Science
