Summary:

The study describes a community-based co-creation process in Ferroviaria, a low-income neighbourhood in Quito, Ecuador, aimed at promoting physical activity and healthy eating to reduce non-communicable disease risk. Using the "Dialogue Forum" method and local health data, community leaders and residents collaboratively developed and implemented a community food garden. The initiative fostered empowerment and social cohesion but faced challenges with sustainability, participation, and potential dominance by community leaders or researchers. The study highlights co-creation as a valuable but complex approach requiring careful attention to local capacity, power dynamics, and long-term community ownership.
